









SUSTAINABILITY

The Gehry Buildings



These three buildings are designed by the American Frank Gehry. They are very remarkable as they differ very much. All three buildings are made of different materials: white plaster, metal and red brick. They are a landmark throughout the city and definitely worth the visit.





Königsallee

This exclusive street in Düsseldorf is a must see! The 'Kö' is a place where people can buy luxurious and exclusive things. The street is packed with fancy hotels, boutiques and you'll also find the Düsseldorf there: the river which the city is named after. It's the most visited street in Germany and it's about one kilometer long! Because of this Allee Düsseldorf counts as one of the most elegant shopping metropolises.



Kö Bogen

This office and retail complex is a very spectacular architectural must see. The building connects the city's central park and historic commercial center. It's a dynamic attraction in the heart of the city. It consists of two structures separated by a passageway and joined at the top by a two-story bridge. Plantings have also been added to the facade which makes sure there's plenty shadow. This public passageway connects the commercial area around the Königsallee with the Hofgarten.

Museum Insel Hombroich

This 'Museum Island' is located just outside Düsseldorf and we highly recommend you to make it part of your journey. The site is a kind of open air museum which invites you to experience art hidden in exceptional architecture pavilions spread over the beautiful natural landscape.

Till august the inside displays a contemporary art collection by Park Seo-Bo.




Kölner Dom



Bonn is located on the Middle Rhine about 24 km from Cologne. Founded in the 1st century BC as a Roman settlement, Bonn is one of Germany's oldest cities. From 1949 to 1990, it was the capital of West Germany, and still served as the seat of the government after the reunification of Germany until 1999. Bonn is therefore a city with a rich History and has the culture of a nation's capital with it's various architectural building styles and museums. For sure worth a visit!

TO VISIT

Haus der Geschichte

This museum gives a complete overview of contemporary German history, from the end of WWII until now, in a very interactive way. Roman ruins were excavated during the building of the museum and have been adapted as an exhibit in the basement. The building itself is from the 1980's. If you like architecture (we hope so) and history, it's the place to be!






Kunstmuseum & Bundeskunsthalle

This fine art museum is dedicated to 20th-century art with the focus on Rhenish Expressionism and post-war German art which can be described as colourful impressionism. The building of the museum has a modern design which conveys a feeling of openness and features eye-triggering staircases. If you have spare time, you can take a look at the Bundeskunsthalle, which is an exhibition center on world-beating temporary shows in the fields of art, science, technology and commerce, as well as congresses, concerts, cinema screenings and annual festivals.

Schloss Drachenburg

About 20 min by car from the city center you can visit this fairytale Gothic Revival castle and its park, both registered as cultural heritage. As the name implies, this is the house where Beethoven was born in 1770. He spent his childhood and teenage years there.






Poppelsdorf Palace & Botanical garden





AACHEN

1 Day visit

Aachen is located in the state North Rhine-Westphalia of Germany and adjoins the Dutch border. The city developed from a Roman settlement and spa. Logically, the name Aachen originally comes from the Latin word Aqua, referring to the springs. There is a very big technical education institute in Aachen, the RWTH Aachen University, which has a big architecture faculty. The most important sights in the city have historical value, like the cathedral and the Rathaus. While visiting, you can not forget to try the local specialty Aachener Printen. It's a form of gingerbread that is sweetened with syrup.

Aachen Cathedral

The building dates from the 9th century and is one of the oldest cathedrals in the whole of Europe. Since 1978 the cathedral is on the UNESCO World Heritage list. There are tours of 45 minutes on every day of the week, but the times vary.

Aachen Rathaus

The Town Hall of Aachen, a building in the Gothic style from the 14th century. This building is a stop on the Route Charlemagne, a tour program with historical sights of Aachen. You can check this out this route if you are interested in the history of the city. The building can be visited every day and during the weekend there are guided tours.



MAASTRICHT

Guide: Charlotte

Maastricht is the capital of the Dutch province of Limburg and is located along the river Maas. The name Maastricht comes from the combination of the Latin words Mosa and Trajectum, together meaning “passage through the Maas”. Maastricht is one of the oldest cities of the Netherlands. However, the city never got any official city right, but rather became a city spread over the centuries. In 1229 the city got permission to build its city walls. The city has had an eventful history, resulting in loads of historical buildings and artistic treasures in churches and museums. The city got international recognition through the Agreement of Maastricht in 1992, solidifying the creation of the European Union. Nowadays, the city of Maastricht is viewed by the Dutch people as a sort of foreign place, because of the city’s location close to the Belgian and German border.

TO VISIT

St. Servaasbasiliek

The Sint-Servaas Basilica is a church in the city center of Maastricht. The church is perfectly located between the three most popular squares of Maastricht: The Vrijthof, The Keizer Karelplein and The Henric van Veldekeplein. It is believed that the church was built on the grave of Sint Servaas, the first verified bisschop of the Netherlands. It is also believed that the Sint-Servaas is the oldest existing church in the Netherlands. The church is build as a three-aisled cross basilica in Romanesque style using coal sandstone and marl. The basilica has been a national monument since 1990 and the cloisters and treasure room are opened to the public daily.





Onze Lieve Vrouwenbasiliek

The Onze Lieve Vrouwe Basilica is a church located in the city center of Maastricht at the Onze Lieve Vrouwe Square. The church is build in the Romanesque style and has been a national monument since 1990. The most famous architectural parts of the church are the west built, the capitals in the ambulatory and the chapel with the impressive Sterre der Zee statue. The church and chapel are open daily and free to roam around in. The cloister and treasure room cost money to visit.

Maastricht Underground

Through the ages a labyrinth of more than 20.000 tunnels has grown underneath the city of Maastricht. These tunnels originate from the extraction of marl, an important building material. Inside the caves and tunnels you can still find writings and drawings that have been left in the marl through the centuries. You can take a guided tour through the northern caves and explore these writings and drawings yourself.

Bonnefantenmuseum

The Bonnefantenmuseum is a museum for visual arts, most famous for its collection of medieval sculptures, paintings from the south of the Netherlands and contemporary art. The current building was designed by the Italian architect Aldo Rossi. With its rocket shaped, 28 meter high tower places along the Maas, the museum is a modern landmark in Maastricht. But despite the postmodern feel of the tower, the museum still gives of a classical vibe.

Fort St. Pieter

This fortress built on the northern side of the Sint-Pieter Hill in 1701. Until 1867 the fortress was part of the fortifications of Maastricht and served a military function. Nowadays, the fortress is a national monument and a famous tourist attraction.

It is a metaphor for the port of the 21st century: a port with a rich past, which is ready for the future. Get a guided tour in the building and learn everything about the design and past and future of the port of Antwerp.

Parkbrug

Het Eilandje and Park Spoor Noord are two urban landscapes with different functions and characters. The Parkbrug provides a connection on foot or by bicycle between these two landscapes. Walking across the bridge is a wonderful experience. A pattern of openings, the texture and structure of the bridge give the feeling of walking through a space. Sun and light will create a play of light and shadow during the day. At night, the bridge will light up the neighborhood like a lantern.





Groen kwartier PAKT

Hot spot for entrepreneurs and urban farmers who feed the heart of Antwerp with creativity and culinary experiments. It is a great business site with, among other things, nice bars and a city garden of two thousand square meters on the roof of the warehouses of PAKT. The city garden is not for free access, but there a plenty events, guided tours and workshops organized!

The Singing Game

Connect song lyrics for a fun sing-along game

The Rules:

- One person starts singing a song.
- Using a lyric from the song, the next person has to connect it with another song.
- It continues on until somebody messes up the lyrics or is stumped.

Example:

“I kissed a girl and I...”

“...Really, really, really like you...”

“...Doing that thing you do, breaking my heart into a million...”

The Alphabet Roadgame

This is an alternative way to play the classic alphabet game.

The Rules:

- Make 2 teams.
- You are trying to find words in alphabetical order.
- You can only use words from things you see outside the car.
- You play as a team and you cannot say two words in a row.
- You win as a team when you get from A to Z.



Regional Food Master

Collect the most regional snacks between the start and finish of your road trip.

The rules:

- Make 2 teams.
- At each gas station you stop at, your team has to find a local snack created within the region the stop is located.
- You can only get one food item per gas station, and the two teams have to get a different snack: first come, first served!
- Whoever has the most snacks by your destination wins.

The Counting Game

See how high you can collectively count without any order.

The rules:

- Somebody random begins with the number one.
- Another person follows at random with the next number.
- If two people say the same number at the same time, you start over.
- If there is more than a five-second pause, you start over.
- You are trying to get to the number 20.



AT THE CAMPING

Beer game

Minimum 6 players

Equipment needed: 6 beer bottles (or other easy to grasp items).

N.B.: There must be the same number of beer bottles as players.

Form 2 teams.

A large designated area is needed. At each end, a 'prison' is made, from a football goal or an area marked by two stumps. On each end line, 'treasures' – 3 beer bottles – are spread out evenly along the whole line. Each team has one half of the field and attacks towards its opponents' end line. When the game starts players may cross the center line into their opponents' territory and try to capture a piece of treasure to bring back to their treasure haul. As soon as they cross the center line, players may be tagged and thus made prisoners.

Prisoners are escorted to prison by their captor and must go quietly. Captors may not tag again until the prisoner has been incarcerated.

Any player who gets to the opposite end line without being tagged may either take one piece of treasure to their own backline or release one prisoner by tagging. As soon as the treasure or prisoner is touched the player is invulnerable and may walk back safely to their area with treasure or prisoner.



The game is won when one team has all the treasure in play along its own backline.

After game: Drink the beer and when the bottles are all empty, play bowling with a ball and the bottles as bowling pins!

Categories

Minimum 2 players.

Equipment needed: pen and paper.

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Each player copies the category-list below (Feel free to add categories!). To pick a letter, one of the players says the alphabet in his/her head and another tells when to stop. The goal is to fill in the category-list with a word starting with the picked letter. When one person has filled in all the columns, the game ends and everyone compare their answers.

For each correct answer which no one else has, you get 2 points. For each correct answer which occurs several times among the players, you get 1 point. You can repeat this mini game as often as you want. At the end, the player with the most points wins.

German Words

Backpfeifengesicht (slap face)

Backpfeifengesicht describes someone who you feel needs a slap in the face. You may want to be careful if and when you use this one: it's best used among good friends unless you're wanting to cause tension!

Kuddelmuddel (muddled mess)

Kuddelmuddel describes mess, chaos, or hodgepodge arrangements or scenes. Clever alternatives which mean the same include Tohuwabohu, Wirrwarr, Mischmasch, and Kladderadatsch.

Kummerspeck (gaining weight from comfort eating)

This one refers to the weight one might gain after a bad relationship break up. This may be one of the strangest literal German/English translations there is.

Treppenwitz (staircase joke)

If the best line, joke, or comeback always occurs to you after speaking to someone who needed to hear it, that's Treppenwitz. It's usually a snappy comeback that comes to your mind on the way out of the door, after you've finished speaking.



Schnapsidee

This is a quirky German word that means, “schnaps idea” or “booze idea”. It’s often used to indicate an idea so incredibly stupid or pointless that it’s originator must be slightly (or very) inebriated. It’s generally used to refer to any idea that seems foolish, stupid or improbable.

Verschlimmbesserung

If you tried to comfort yourself with ice-cream and it fell on the ground, it can only be described as Verschlimmbesserung. While this German word doesn’t have a simple literal translation, it describes an attempt at improving a bad or hopeless situation, but this attempt only makes things worse.


